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

The Ukraine is a vast country (374,294 sq miles), almost the size of Texas and New Mexico combined. It lies between Russia and central Europe and has a population of forty-nine million people. Its capital is Kiev, where Slavic Christianity was born more than a thousand years ago. Most Ukrainians are of the Orthodox faith, with many others of the Greek, or Uniate Catholic Church. Evangelical Christians make up less than four percent of the population. However eighty-nine percent of the population identifies itself as Christian.



Ethnic lines are blurred with widespread inter-marriage, especially between Ukrainians and Russians. Ukrainian is the official language, with Russian being spoken and understood by almost everyone. A great tragedy occurred on April 26, 1986 when the Number Four reactor at the nuclear power plant at Chernobyl exploded, releasing thirty to forty times the radioactivity of the atomic bombs dropped on Hiroshima and Nagasaki, Japan. Hundreds of thousands of Ukrainians, Russians and Belorussian were affected and several million are still living in

contaminated areas. Each year at the Go Ye camp, we have young people who are suffering from the effects of the radiation.

Most of the young people now at the Go Ye camp were only small when the Ukraine was part of the Soviet Union. I find myself able to talk about that period of their history,

knowing more about it than they do. It was on November 9, 1989 that the Berlin Wall fell. In 1991, I was standing on the square in the center of Lviv when the Ukraine declared independence. It was a euphoric and glorious moment as people laughed and cried when the Ukrainian flag was displayed. There was the possibility of the former Soviet Republic transforming itself into a thriving economy and a European democracy. But corruption and red tape continue to stifle the economy and any real changes.

## The right to freedom of thought and speech, and to the free expressions of his or her views and beliefs.

Nonetheless, on June 28, 1996, the fifth session of the Verkhovna Rada (Ukraine Congress) adopted The Constitution of Ukraine. Article 34: " Guaranteed the right to freedom of thought and speech, and to the free expressions of his or her views and beliefs. To freely collect, store, use and disseminate

information by oral, written or other means of his or her choice." Article 35:" Everyone has the right to freedom of personal philosophy and religion, to perform alone or collectively and without constraint religious rites and ceremonial rituals, and to conduct religious activity. The Church and religious organizations in Ukraine are separate from the State, and the school from The Church. No religion shall be recognized by the state as mandatory." Article 36, gives citizens of Ukraine the right to "freedom of assembly," etc.

## Go Ye has conducted yearly youth camps

Go Ye has conducted yearly youth camps since 1991. We have seen nearly two hundred fifty converts with many now serving as pastors or missionaries, and in other positions of leadership. There were again this year about seventy-five people present. There was a spirit of unity and God's presence and anointing on the daily lectures and evening messages. Twenty-three young people came forward for salvation (thirteen boys and ten girls). There were some back from last year's camp that brought friends so that their friends could receive the gift of eternal life through Christ Jesus!

Brother Peter, the man I have worked with since 1989, emigrated to the United States in August 2002. Leadership has been passed to a much younger pastor who has a burden for young people. I look forward to the 2003 camp with both concern and excitement as my trust is in the God of heaven and earth *"that is able to do exceeding abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that worketh in us,"* (Ephesians 3:20).

# Testimonies From Youth Camp

I have been blessed to hear many stories of missionaries down through the years who have answered the call of God to follow Christ and to reach out to others. Therefore, I was honored and humbled when my Uncle Roger said that he felt God had impressed upon him to invite me to go with him this past summer to Go Ye Ministries annual Ukraine Youth Camp in July.

My parents and I spent a lot of time seeking God concerning whether I should go or not, and God did open up the way for me to go. What followed was truly some essential spiritual lessons for me. One lesson was that the people you go to minister, and to bless, could minister, teach, and touch you double fold. The Ukrainian people I met were literally, all the time just seeking to do something for you.

Another lesson I learned was, you can plan, work, and have everything seemingly perfect, but without the presence and touch of God it's just another message, song, or praise time. For instance I noticed my Uncle and the youth camp leaders did the ninety-nine percent preparation, but then they stood back and let God do the impossible in touching and "saving" lives.

### *"Christ's presence filled the room"*

Sometimes, when the young people would go down to accept the Lord, you could feel Christ's presence fill the room. The hunger that I sensed and saw for God in the young people was awe-inspiring to me.

I noticed about the leaders over the camp, that they practiced Christ teaching of; "... He that is greatest among you shall be your servant" (Matt 23:11). They truly waited on everybody and gave them individual attention. All ages, and from different background situations, seemed to have a hunger for God's truth and love.

Something that I saw about them, and that surprised me at times, was the lack of basic knowledge about the Bible, and Jesus, and their desire to know more. Another fact that surprised me and filled me with a great sympathy was that many of the young people who had accepted Christ at camp the year before had gone through many trials with their parents since their conversion last summer. Their parents, (some of them), would not allow them to go to church, and yet they had kept their faith and had come back to camp again. I am praying that God will send forth laborers to answer their questions about God, the Bible, and life.

I'd like to close my testimony with this verse from Matthew 9:37-38, "Then saith he unto his disciples, The harvest truly is plenteous, but the laborers are few, pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he will send forth laborers into his harvest." # Babel




**" . . . I beheld Satan as lighting fall from heaven" (Luke 10:18).**

The origin of rebellion started with Lucifer (Satan) in heaven. It continued on earth with Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden and with Cain

Nimrod tamed a leopard to accompany him on his hunts, for wild animals and men. Upon catching them, he would enslave them and have a tyrannical hold over them. Some one hundred (if there are no gaps) to five hundred years after the flood (depending on which date is correct) with a possible world population of twenty-five thousand plus to several million people, man under the leadership of

She later conceived through adultery and gave birth to an illegitimate son whom she named Tammuz. She declared he was actually Nimrod reborn, and that he had been supernaturally conceived. However, even though Queen Semiramis claimed to have given birth to a savior, it was she that was worshipped, not her son. She was worshipped as the mother of the gods. The worship of a divine woman and godchild began long before the virgin birth of Jesus. This woman appears in different cultures and is called by different names, but she is always the same person: Isis in Egypt, Indrainsi, Cybelle in Asia, Fortuna (the boy) in Rome, Ceres in Greece, Shing Moo in China, Hertha in Germany, Sisa in Scandanavia, etc. But this woman was really Semiramis, the Queen of Babylon. Israel, when it fell into apostasy, worshipped Ashteroth, who was known to the Jews as the "Queen of Heaven" (Jeremiah 44: 17-19).



murdering his brother Abel. The rebellion that started in heaven climaxes with God bringing judgment and destroying the whole earth and everything that had breath in it by a flood. "But Noah found grace in the eyes of the Lord" (Genesis 6:8). After the flood the Bible says, "And God blessed Noah and his sons, and said unto them, be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth" (Genesis 9:1). It is through Noah's youngest son Ham, and his descendants, that we meet a man named Nimrod. His name means, "Let us revolt." "And Cush begat Nimrod: he began to be a mighty one in the earth. He was a mighty hunter before the Lord: wherefore it is said, even as Nimrod the mighty hunter before the Lord. And the beginning of his kingdom was Babel, and Erech, and Accad, and Calneh in the land of Shinar" (present day Iraq) (Genesis 10: 8-10).

Nimrod starts building a tower (ziggurat) where he could be supreme. "... Let us build us a city and a tower, whose top may reach unto heaven, and let us make us a name, ..." (Genesis 11:4).

It would be at this tower, with its walls and ceilings painted with birds, four-footed beasts, and creeping things (Ref. Romans 1:23), that Nimrod, through demonic intelligence and satanic power, would take the universal signs of the zodiac and distort them into astrology, and institute the worship of the host of heaven. It is at this tower and city that God would laugh at their efforts (Ref. Psalm 2:1-5). Babel means "mixed or confusion." God would change the language of the earth to languages and scatter them across the face of the earth. Following the death of Nimrod, this heathen form of worship was continued by his wife, Queen Semiramis. She claimed that her husband Nimrod had become the Sun god, or in his deified form, Baal, and was to be worshipped.

The scattered people from the tower of Babel carried the Babylonian religion to all parts of the globe. Yet they also carried a faint knowledge of the true God and could see evidence of him. "For the invisible things of him from the creation of the world are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even his eternal power and Godhead, so that they are without excuse" (Romans 1:20).

Are we not also guilty of building a tower in our own life or lifestyle that we might have our own way? Do we not by our actions, have the same spirit

of pride? A place where we want to accomplish our own purposes? A place where, not only did it seem right to do this, but it felt right? There was unity and a consensus to establish this new way to worship. No longer would they have to be dependent on this God that had destroyed the world by a flood, that demanded a blood sacrifice, but in this new bond of endeavor, they could create new gods that were less demanding and easier to please by human means. They could establish their own righteousness that would bring glory by fleshly means and efforts. Are not most of the programs and preaching today to make us feel good? We have substituted programs and messages of psychology because we have conveniently forgotten that it is prayer and the Holy Spirit that brings the anointing and the mind of God. If the church does call for prayer meetings, they often end up as fellowship meetings as it is too hard to seek God. It requires us to concentrate and focus on him rather than what makes us feel good. Besides, we have unity in what we are doing. Does not unity equate to the work of the Holy Spirit? However, it should never be unity for its own sake but effectiveness.


Just as Nimrod knew God's com-

mands, (for he was a contemporary of probably Noah and certainly of Shem, Arphaxad, Salah, and Eber), we also today know what the Bible says. We can quote the Scriptures, they are marked in our Bibles. It's not our orthodoxy that is flawed, but our orthopraxy. Jesus said, *"This people draw nigh unto me with their mouth."* It is not because we don't have knowledge of truth; there is more knowledge today than ever, but to practice it and be obedient to God is too demanding. We say prayers without praying.

There is no humility in our form or in our request. Our prayer is for fleshly things rather than spiritual

food. *"Labour not for the meat which perisheth, but for that meat which endureth unto everlasting life..."* (John 6:27a). Where is our burden for others? Where is our concern for the body of Christ that we are part of? *"And whether one member suffer, all the members suffer with it, or one member be honored, all the members rejoice with it"* (I Corinthians 12:26). If it does not bring benefits to "Me" personally, then my attention and concern quickly diminish. Where are the men and women who can say, *"God said?"* Who have sought God in humility and have heard from heaven. Who say what has been bathed in prayer and ordained by the Holy Spirit. Instead, we hear that there is unity and so it must be from God. Unity for the sake of unity is conformity. Is it not better to be divided in truth than united in error? Cannot honest men have honest differences and be willing to pray and seek God for direction until someone has heard from heaven and God gives His word that shows us *"this is His way"* for this time? *"All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness"* (II Timothy 3:16). I am not talking about flipping through the Bible to find a scripture that proves a point, but about the Holy Spirit giving direction through the word that brings harmony (not necessarily unity) in our quest to

## HOW TO HAVE A HEALTHY TEMPLE OF GOD AND ENJOYING OPTIMUM HEALTH

**H**ave you heard the saying that you have everything, when you have your health?

Inversely, when we lose our health, we lose something very important, to the point of being unable to go and preach the gospel to anyone. Instead of going into all the world to teach the good news of Jesus, it has become the norm for the American Christian to be sick; so going to doctors and getting drugs has replaced the going into the world to preach. The average American spends his last years on drugs, which is permitting the devil to rob that same money from being used for the work of spreading the gospel, not to mention the time and gas spent in such doctor and pharmacy visits! All the while, the side affects of drugs are taking the patient closer to the grave, as his energy diminishes, memory evaporates, and ability to think, dies. Such has become the accepted way of life, but is it God's way?

What had God said? Psalm 92:12-15 says, *"The righteous shall flourish like the palm tree; ... they shall still bring forth fruit in old age ... to show that the Lord is upright."* Further, keeping the body in functional condition is part of sanctification as we live in obedience to Him whose temple the Christian's body is, as seen in 1 Thessalonians 5:23, *"And the very God of peace sanctify you wholly: and I pray God your whole spirit and soul and body be preserved blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ."* In other words, don't let the body get so sick to the point of **BLAMING** it as the reason for our being unable to go and tell the gospel. How often I hear folks say, "I'm not able" or "I don't have the money or energy to go!" Is that kind of body a blameless-preserved one? We've brought so

much sickness on ourselves by turning away from what God says to do or not to do. Then we substitute the desire of our undisciplined or depraved flesh, and when we become so uncomfortable or castaway or disable, we pray to God to heal us, still refusing to adopt His ordained life style. We must do as Paul in 1 Corinthians 9:27, *"I keep under my body, and bring it into subjection: least that by any means, when I have preached to others, I myself should be a castaway."* We Christians say that we believe the whole Bible; however, many reject the truth that God's word tells us what to eat or not. We argue that the Bible doesn't talk about physical exercise, and even joke about being too fat. I submit to you that such behavior angers God, because it shows how much of His own words are being ignored by His people. We glibly quote Psalm 103:2-5. *"Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits: "... who healeth all thy diseases; who redeemeth thy life from destruction:... who satisfieth thy mouth with good things; so that thy youth is renewed like the eagle's."* These promises are spoken by us,

even as we fail to connect them with our life style; our menu disregards God's commands, so we are in essence asking Him to redeem our lives from destruction, even though we eat contrarily to the Bible. Also, we claim that our youth is renewed like that of the eagle, all the while sitting planted on the sofa, watching TV, instead of burning energy, as does the eagle when it flies around. In other words, it is the age old idea of wanting the privilege without the responsibility; we want the benefits but do not do the actions, that result in those blessings of God. Unfortunately, that won't work, because of God's ordained law of sowing and reaping, or cause and effect. If we want His benefits, we must walk in His ways and not ignore them. So many ignore so much of the Bible by saying that the dietary law is just for the Jew or just the Old Testament, and that it is no longer applicable, because it was cancelled or done away with by Jesus; however, that is a lie from the devil, who wants to destroy the Christian and the spreading of the salvation news. Think now! America sends more missionaries than does



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any other nation, and more money for missions is from her than from any other country on earth; therefore, if the devil can deceive the American Christian and keep them preoccupied with sickness, then they are ineffective in the spread of the gospel. It has occurred to me that the "New Age" folks know how to eat right, which matches quite well with that which is in the Bible; Eastern religions and Native Americans generally know those truths also. Folks of poor countries end up eating out of the ground, primarily things as rice, potatoes, beans, etc. In fact, even the poor of America are eating quite healthy, when they eat beans and potatoes, rather than all the processed foods and so much meat. Jesus said in Matthew 5:17, *"Think not that I am come to destroy the law, or the prophets: I am not come to destroy, but to fulfill."* Since he didn't destroy the Old Testament, but lived by it or fulfilled it, it means that we can't ignore God's words, all of which are so that it will be *"well with us."* What Jesus did on the cross means that no more sacrificial lamb, goat, dove, bull, grain, etc. type of sacrifice is necessary. Jesus is the Lamb that takes away the sin of the world; thus, He became the Lamb, that was sacrificed for all of us, so we don't need to kill animals ceremonially for our sin debt. Everything that Jesus did was to fulfill, not be opposed to, the words of God. He would have obeyed the dietary instructions. Actually, His whole life style is a perfect example for perfect health. Let's do a quick study of what He would have obeyed.

Since the two things necessary for health are always exercise, and proper nutrition, let's see what the Bible says about them. In Genesis 2:15, we read that God designed physical work, even in a perfect sinless environment. *"And the LORD God took the man, and put him into the garden of Eden to dress it*



*and to keep it."* No wonder today's researchers are saying that the best exercise is GARDENING. Once again we see that whatever God does is forever. In gardening one uses many muscles, pulling weeds, digging the ground, pushing things, squatting, stretching, lifting, etc. Of course, walking is required in all this, and Jesus's primary mode of transportation was walking.

The Bible encourages the eating of vegetables. Genesis 1:29 at the time of creation, God said, *"Behold, I have given you every herb bearing seed, which is upon the face of all the earth, and every tree, in the which is the fruit of a tree yielding seed; to you it shall be for meat."* This means we are to eat fruit, vegetables, all herbs, and grains which grow as tall grass, such as barley, corn, rice, wheat, millet, etc. The less processing or altering from the original state of these items, the better. We can't improve on what God has grown. Brown rice offers us more good than does white rice, which has been tampered with by humans and the nutri-

ents taking out. Meat wasn't added to our menu until after Noah's flood, as we read in Genesis. 9:3-4. even then, God said to eat every MOVING thing that lives, but never eat the blood. Consider this, today's animals are raised not for nutrition, but for money. They are fed hormones and drugs, so as to grow large quickly, to bring in more money. As for their MOVING or being active-forget it. Each chicken has their own assigned cage, so how much moving can they do? Again, we humans have adulterated away from God's design. Do realize that we are seeing the eating instructions, which are for humans in general, not just for Israel, because God's words of Genesis 1:29 were pre-Mosaic. Abraham served a supper to heavenly guests in Genesis 18:6-8. What was that menu - - home made cakes or bread with fine or good (Not re-fined) meal, fresh calf, milk, and butter. Notice there is no pork, and this is before the Mosaic law was given which was 600 years later. The Bible recounts that there was not one feeble

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recounts that there was not one feeble among the tribes, when Israel left Egypt in Palms 10:37. Recently, the thought came to me, that one of the reasons for their being in good physical condition was their having worked so much, moving constantly, as they hunted for straw and stubble, not to mention how hot they got as they sweated while baking bricks. In 1 Samuel 17:17-18, the food that David the teen-ager took to his brothers in the battle field: parched grain, with ten loaves and ten cheeses. A few years later in 1 Samuel 25:18, we see the godly lady, Abigail, offering to David two hundred loaves, two bottles of wine, five sheep already dressed for eating, parched grain, clusters of raisins and figs. Note again that pig is not mentioned, because both David's father Jesse, and his future wife Abigail would have known Leviticus. Jesus would have eaten the items mentioned above, and we know what He ate as sugar, because Isaiah 7:15 prophesies that the virgin born Messiah would eat butter and honey. Proverbs 24:13 says to eat honey and honeycomb. Jesus after the resurrection ate broiled fish and honeycomb when He appeared to the disciples in Luke 24:42. In John 6:9, the boy's lunch with which Jesus fed the multitude was barley loaves and fish; thus, it consisted of what God had said to eat. Leviticus chapter 11 must be studied and obeyed. In verse 4, God says not to eat camel, coney, rabbit, and verse 7 emphasizes that the pig is unclean, and not to be eaten. Verse 9 tells us to eat fish, which has fins

and scales, and we are not to eat those which are without fins and scales. This means that we eat no catfish or any shellfish, as shrimp, lobster, etc. Common sense ought to lead us to realize that such things cannot flush out the dirt, as everything just stays entombed within the shell. You know how the shrimp smells! Just imagine that odor inside our body for days, after we eat it. No wonder we carry so much rotted corroded flesh within our bodies! Imagine how dirty a pan would be if you kept greasy meat in it for days and years and leave it in a place of 98 or 99 degrees. Can you imagine the smell and the rotting? Actually, I believe this is what leads to so much cancer in our day. If the ten commandments are still true for us today, then so are these promises of healing true, if we obey the Bible.

People use Acts 10:9-15 to say that unclean things can be eaten because it cancels Leviticus 11; doing away with dietary precepts. Acts 10 is saying that the gospel of eternal life will now go also unto the Gentiles, instead of excluding them. While praying and in a trance, Peter saw descending from heaven to earth a vessel, containing all manner of beasts, creeping things, and fowls of the air, which he was told to eat. In verse 14, Peter said, "I have never eaten any thing that is common or unclean;" thus, testifying that he had obeyed Leviticus 11, indeed even during the years of being with Jesus during his earthly ministry. Verse 15 says, "What God hath cleansed, that call not thou common". This directive was given three times, just as Jesus three times before his ascension had told Peter to feed his lambs. Verse 15 clearly shows that the beasts in the vessel were what God has Cleaned, so these animals can not be referring to that which God had already called as unclean or bad in Leviticus 11, unless God is double

minded or schizophrenic, and of course, He is stable and immutable or unchanging. In verse 28, Peter says to Cornelius and company, "Ye know how that it is an unlawful thing for a man that is a Jew to keep company, or come unto one of another nation: but God hath showed me that I should not call any man (not beast) common or unclean." Peter preached Jesus to the gathered Gentiles, saying in verse 43 that all the prophets (Old Testament) give witness to Him, and that whosoever believes in Him shall receive remission of sins. While Peter was still speaking, the Holy Ghost fell on all the listeners, who were Gentiles, so that the Jews, who had come with Peter, were astonished, because the Holy Spirit was poured also on the Gentiles. Salvation by the faith in Jesus had now gone to the Non-Jew. Interestingly, it is from this Cornelius's city, Joppa, that Apostle Paul would later embark on a ship to Rome, to which he took the gospel that would spread to the world. How shall we today then appropriate God's commands, in order to enjoy health, so that we can do the great commission? Let me list first some Don'ts, before listing the Do's:

### Things Not to Do:

1. Do not increase MEAT consumption, especially pork. Isaiah 65: 2-4, God says, "I have spread out my hands all the day unto a rebellious people, which walketh in a way that was not good, after their own thoughts; a people that provoketh me to anger continually to my face; ... which remain among the graves, ... which eat flesh, and broth of abominable things is in their vessels." The old saying is right; we are what we eat. Johns Hopkins study of twenty meats in order of purity says that pork is 46.5 percent fat POISON, while beef is 4 percent, and deer is only 3 percent. Now, can you see that the active

moving deer is purer? God says eleven times in the Bible that the pig is an abomination. Think about all those demons that went into pigs and destroyed them. Apparently, demons feel at home in unclean environment.

**2.** MARGARINE, because of hydrogenation, which makes gunky gumminess in your arteries. Use butter instead, our total fat in a day should only be two or three tablespoons. Butter was used in the Bible. The best oil is olive oil, as in Psalm 104:15, which says oil makes our face shine. Just remember, always choose PLANT life, directly from the ground, rather than animals as food source.

**3.** Get away from WHITE SUGAR, it is too processed.

**4.** Drink Pure WATER. It is molecularly perfect for digestion; no wonder, it is God designed. Don't drink coffee, tea, soft drinks or alcohol, but drink at least eight glasses of water daily.

**5.** Eat RAW fruit, rather than cooked, because cooking kills the enzymes so that you are shortening your life by using the innate supply of enzymes in your body.

**6.** Eat less milk, cheese, and eggs. If you must have milk, use soy, rice or goats milk, Proverbs 27:27 says, "*Thou shall have goats milk enough for thy food.*"

**7.** Totally eliminate ARTIFICIAL SWEETNERS, which is processed and even further than white sugar, which itself is already processed at least seventeen times! Aspartame can ruin some people's brain, so much that some airline pilots have had to quit their work.

### Things to Do:

**1.** Increase consumption of fruit, especially the fresh. After all, that is the first thing Adam ate in the Garden of Eden.

**2.** Eat more VEGETABLES, as they contain minerals, of which we are short. The average veggie helping has only 25 calories, so we can eat 20 helpings of vegetables for the 500 calories, which are in some single helping of meat.

**3.** Eat a palm full of nuts and seeds daily. It will help towards preventing prostate trouble.

**4.** Eat whole grains. Hippocrates in 400 B.C. said that he used barley paste to treat asthma, infections, sore throat, etc. In eating bread, choose whole grain, never the white.


If we'll implement the above guidelines, we'll turn our sick cells into healthy ones by flushing the poisons out and by eating nutritious foods. Common sense tells us that the closer to the original condition of something we can intake, the more benefit will be ours. Psalm 104:14 says that God causes the herbs to grow, so that it can serve us humans, that we may bring forth out of the earth. The most nutritious would be if we'd eat raw fruits and raw vegetables right out of the ground, uncooked. Actually, they have already been cooked by the sun, washed by the rain, tempered by natural breeze, as God gave that which is good, to cause the earth to yield its increase. Just remember, that whatever we humans do to anything is not to improve it but subtraction or ruination.

As for exercising to remove things that ought to be removed from us, take walks if possible. The author

of this article is totally blind, living alone as a single female. I've figured out other ways of exercising, because walking alone isn't recommended. One inexpensive, and very good exercise equipment is the mini-trampoline or the rebounder, which I bought at Walmart for \$15. Jumping gently for only five or six minutes daily would aid much in keeping our lymph system clean, so that cancer and other degenerative diseases wouldn't lodge and develop in our body, which is, after all, the home of the Holy Spirit of God. Let's obey God's commands about caring for our bodies, so that we can be vibrant laborers in His vineyard until He comes. Walk in all His ways, remembering He said in Psalm 85:8b "*Let them not turn again to folly.*" Don't let the devil win by deceiving us to think that moderation of everything is okay. If God calls something an abomination, we shouldn't use moderation to negate it! Let's obey Him, instead of making excuses, so that He can preserve us blamelessly! God's will is that we be strong in Him, as shown in Psalm 68:28. "*Thy God hath commanded thy strength.*" Note that He did not command our WEAKNESS. You may be saying that you are free to choose what you eat, or do. Never forget that you are certainly not free from consequences. Of course, for a jungle missionary without choice or availability of food, the situation is understandably different, and in that case, God will fulfill His promise of Mark 16:18 and protect the missionary supernaturally. I'm speaking about those of us, who willfully ignore God's dietary instructions by preferring the unhealthy desire of the depraved appetite. If you want to head northward, turn around from traveling southward. Prov.14:27 tells us. "*The fear of the Lord is a fountain of life, to depart from the snares of death.*" Let's live in that holy fear, so that we'll thrive in Him, whose word is the fountain of life!



know and do His will. God abhors our religious pretext. God rebuked Israel for keeping the external requirements of the law while disregarding a heart relationship with Him. The outward requirements of the law were meaningless without an inward relationship with the living God (Ref. Isaiah 1:13-14; Amos 5:21). It is our very nature to trust




in our own righteousness. As long as we keep all the outward laws that we have made, there's a sense of pride, of accomplishment; we are the "standard" by which to measure others. The Apostle Paul said these very words, describing himself: "...Touching the righteousness which is in the law, blame-



less," (Philippians 3:16). We must renounce these things as Paul did. They are stones in our tower that are a direct offense to God. "... and do count them but dung, that I may win Christ, and be found in him, not having mine own righteousness, which is of the law, but that which is through the faith of Christ, the righteousness which is of God by faith" (Philippians 3:8b, 9). O dear friend, are you trusting in "anything" other than "His righteousness?" Just hours before Jesus was betrayed as he sat with his disciples at the Passover meal, they concluded the "Seder" with the latter half of the "Hallel" (Psalm 115-118). How could Jesus sing these words and rejoice, knowing that he was only hours from fulfilling them? He would be crucified and die a horrible death. The innocent for the guilty, the humble for the proud, the incorruptible for the corruptible, the eternal for the temporal. "... but by his own blood he entered in once into the holy place, having obtained eternal redemption for us" (Hebrews 9:12b).

Any of our righteousness that supplants his righteousness, we must renounce and repent, and look to Him "...the author and finisher of our faith, ..." (Hebrews 12:2). We cannot add to or take away from his finished work of grace. "For by grace are you saved through faith, and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God", (Ephesians 2:8). Not only did his precious blood cleanse us, but it also was taken to the heavenly altar to cleanse heaven where sin originated. "It was therefore necessary that the patterns of things in the heavens should be purified with these, but the heavenly things themselves with better sacrifices than these" (Hebrews 9:23). Let us not add more bricks to our tower. Bricks of self-importance, egoism, egotism, vanity, conceit, self-love, self-glorification, vainglory, immodesty, smugness, self-satisfaction,



pomp, pretension, arrogance, haughtiness, I, me, mine, etc. Let us "...repent, and do the first works; ..." (Revelation 2:5) and renounce "...the hidden things of dishonesty," (II Corinthians 4:2).

Dear friend, I speak to myself before I write this to you. I know what it is to substitute my righteousness for his righteousness; my works for the work of the Holy Spirit. It is not difficult to do or to justify. I know what it is to not forgive, to allow rebellion and sin to take a strong hold in my life, to want my way more than God's way, to allow pride that seat of authority that belongs only to God. He requires all, or He removes himself allowing us to build our own tower. This spirit of rebellion, this "mystery of iniquity" ( II Thessalonians 2:7) that has permeated the world will end at the "end of the age." "And upon her forehead was a name written, MYSTERY, BABYLON THE GREAT, THE MOTHER OF HARLOTS AND ABOMINATIONS OF THE EARTH" (Revelation 17:5).

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
